



## RECIPE



#### French Breakfast Muffins

1 1/2 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 cup sugar

1 1/2 teaspoons baking powder

1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1/8 teaspoon salt

1 egg

1/2 cup milk

1/3 cup butter or margarine, melted

1/4 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 cup butter or margarine, melted

1. In a mixing bowl combine flour, the 1/2 cup sugar, baking powder, nutmeg, and salt. Make a well in the center of the dry ingredients.

- 2. In another bowl beat egg slightly; stir in milk and 1/3 cup melted butter or margarine. Add egg mixture to flour mixture. Stir just until moistened (the batter may be lumpy). Lightly grease muffin cups. Fill cups about two-thirds full with batter. Bake in a 350 degree oven for 20 to 25 minutes or until muffins are golden.
- 3. Meanwhile, in a shallow bowl combine the 1/4 cup sugar and cinnamon. Immediately dip tops of hot muffins into the 1/4 cup melted butter or margarine, then into the cinnamon-sugar mixture until coated. Serve warm. Makes 12 muffins.

# Pastor's Notes... and Worship in February

DURING WORSHIP IN FEBRUARY, we'll continue our study "Jesus the Messiah." This is the third story in our year-long series: The Five Big Stories of the Bible.

This month we'll focus on the teachings of Jesus – teachings as relevant for us now as they were for the people that lived during the time of Jesus.

This month is also the start of the forty-day season of Lent, an opportunity for us to examine our lives, confess our sins, renew our relationship with God, and commit to be better.

Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 18. Bring a guest to worship this month, to Family Skate Night on Sunday evening, February 15, and to the Valentine Prayer Breakfast on Saturday morning, February 21.

#### February 1 – Holy Communion "The Sermon on the Mount" Matthew 5:1-7:27


During his ministry Jesus taught us how to live. He starts "The Sermon on the Mount" this way: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted..." (Matt. 53-4).

These words speak deeply to all of us. Who hasn't been "down" at some point? Who hasn't suffered loss?

Jesus continues, explaining in a new way what God has always expected of us.

For example, it is understood that murder is the taking of another's life. But God also wants us to understand that "anyone who is angry with his brother or sister" (5:21-22) is also taking life away from another. In the "Sermon on the Mount" Jesus challenges us to live fully as God's people.

February 8
"Jesus Instructs His Disciples"
Matthew 10:5-42



Jesus chose twelve to assist him in his ministry. As he sent them out to minister, he instructed them, "As you go, preach this message: 'The kingdom of heaven is near'" (10:7).

He encouraged, "if people will not listen to you 'let your peace return to you'" (10:13).

He taught them not to lose hope; that God would provide for them. "When they arrest you, do not worry about what to say or how to say it. At that time you will be given what to say, for it will not be you speaking, but the Spirit of your Father speaking through you" (10:19-20).

As we respond to God's call today to "Invite Others to Christ," Jesus' instructions continue to offer us great encouragement and support.

#### February 18 – Ash Wednesday "Jesus Teaches Through Parables" Matthew 13:3-52

Many times Jesus taught using parables – stories from everyday life. He

used situations people encountered in their daily lives to explain life in the kingdom of God.

In the "Parable of the Sower," seed is planted in hard soil, rocky soil, soil overgrown with weeds, and fertile soil. In all but the last, the seed does not grow.

Life as God's people is the same. Jesus teaches us, models life for us, even dies for us and is raised again. Jesus invites us to believe in him and follow him. This is the seed that is planted in us by Jesus.

People respond differently. Some are too "hardened" in their attitude to believe and follow Jesus.

Others get all excited and initially follow but when life becomes "rocky" they turn away.

Some want to believe but their life becomes overgrown with cares and they gradually forget about Jesus.

But it's as true now as it was then – we live good, full lives when we believe in Christ and follow him.

#### February 22 "The Meaning of Discipleship" Matthew 18:1-35

Jesus teaches us to be humble – to admit that we can't go it alone, that we're not God, and that we need God (18:1-9).

Jesus teaches us to seek out the lost and help bring them to Christ by showing them God's love (18:10-14).

Jesus teaches us to always seek all the good we can for others, and to do no harm to another (18:15-20).

Jesus teaches us to forgive those who have sinned against us, just as God has forgiven us for the ways we have sinned (18:21-35).

Before turning to Jerusalem and his death on the cross, Jesus was taking the time to teach his followers how to be true disciples.

As we study these verses today, Jesus continues to teach us the true meaning of discipleship.

#### **LENT**

Lent is the 40-day period from Ash Wednesday to Easter. It was first observed in the fourth century, and its focus was on self-examination and self-denial in preparation for Easter. Lent is often a time when Christians give up something pleasurable.




