

What is a Lord's Acre Festival?

In 1930, the Lord's Acre idea began in western North Carolina as a means of raising funds for small country churches. A portion or "acre" of a church member's land was set aside to raise crops to be sold to benefit the church. Even livestock was dedicated. Those without land could set aside a portion of their needlework, craft items, or any other saleable talent they possessed. The Lord's Acre Festival is a sale of those donations.

Salem's Lord's Acre Festival, which began in 1960, was first held in the old Wolfsville School where Salem's parsonage now stands. In 1970, the festival was moved to the Ruritan Park where it has grown to what it is today.

Featured Quilt

The featured quilt (pictured at right) will be on display beginning at 2 p.m., and will be sold at auction at 6 p.m. to the highest bidder.

The quilt has a brown background and is accented by 10 hand-embroidered squares of nostalgia items that many will remember and perhaps have even used years ago; and 10 white quilted design squares.

The full/queen size quilt was designed and embroidered by members of Salem United Methodist Church, Wolfsville; and was beautifully hand quilted by the Zion Quilters of Middletown, Maryland.

2014 - Upgraded sound system.


2015 - Replaced parsonage kitchen floor and clothes washer, replaced social room window treatment, replaced laptop, and added shelving for food pantry.

Just 11 More Mosquitos

As fall approaches, it reminds us that the year is three-quarters completed. The weather gets cooler, and we have less problems with mosquitos. But many countries in the world have mosquito problems year round, and that is why the Baltimore-Washington Conference of the United Methodist Church committed to the "Imagine No Malaria" program.

In 2014, Salem's Administrative Council pledged \$2,820 to "Imagine No Malaria." As of July 31, 2015, \$432 remains to be paid on this pledge. Your help is needed to reach our goal. Your donations can be made along with your weekly offering; just note "Imagine No Malaria" on your check or offering envelope.



On the hallway display at the church, each mosquito on the net represents a \$40 donation. We still have 11 mosquitos to "swat" and remove from the net by the end of 2015.

RECIPE



Chocolate Peppermint Cookies

Ingredients for Cookies:

2 cups all-purpose flour

3/4 cups unsweetened cocoa powder 3/4 cup sugar

1 teaspoon baking soda

1/4 teaspoon salt

1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, room temperature

1 cup packed light brown sugar

2 eggs

2 teaspoons vanilla extract

2 cups chocolate chips

Ingredients for Glaze:

3/4 cup confectioners' sugar 3 1/2 teaspoons water 2 drops mint extract, or more to taste Few drops of green food color

Directions for the Cookies:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

In a medium bowl sift together flour, cocoa powder, baking soda and salt. Set aside. In a mixer beat together the butter with the sugars until fluffy, about 2 minutes. Add eggs 1 at a time, beating until smooth after each addition and scraping the sides of the bowl as necessary. Add in the vanilla. On a low speed beat in the flour mixture a little at a time. Gently mix in chocolate chips.

On an ungreased cookie sheet, drop teaspoons of the batter about 2 inches apart. Bake until just cracked on top, about 8 to 10 minutes, rotating the pan halfway through the cooking time. Cool completely.

Directions for the Glaze:

In a small bowl mix together the sugar; mint extract and water until smooth. Transfer mixture to a medium resealable plastic bag and snip off the corner. Drizzle glaze over cooled cookies. Let cookies stand until set, about 10 minutes.

Ending Hunger One Step at a Time

Imagine you're in Kenya, a country in Africa. You're walking to get water that you'll carry back home in a 5-gallon jerry can balanced on your head. Your family needs this water for drinking, bathing, preparing meals or watering the garden or livestock. Whatever the reason, 5 gallons of water weighs about 42 pounds, and you may have to walk miles to get it. It would be so helpful to have a community well!

The Wolfsville/Myersville CROP Hunger Walk could help you get that well. \$30 can drill one meter of a shallow borehole well – providing clean water for your community. With water nearby, you have time to grow and tend more vegetables, raise more livestock, or work at your business. Your family will have clean water to drink, and be less likely to be sick or die from disease.

The CROP Hunger Walk raises funds for Church World Service to use for projects to eliminate hunger in more than 80 countries around the world, including the United States. It provides resources to dig wells, provide emergency food and supplies to refugees and victims of natural disasters, feed malnourished children and improve health care. CROP funds assist with educational and occupational opportunities so families

can provide food for themselves.

So how do you get involved? On Sunday, September 27, the annual Wolfsville/Myersville CROP Hunger Walk takes place. The 5-mile walk starts at Salem United Methodist Church at 1:30 p.m. and circles around our country roads back to the church. Registration begins at 1 p.m. We need walkers and sponsors and prayer partners!


Walkers can get a sponsor form from me. Sign up sponsors, who pledge a flat amount or so much per mile. Collect the pledges from your sponsors, and return them to me the day of the walk or by October 18.
