Turning "shoe boxes" into Christmas gifts for children

Share the love of Jesus, through the power of a simple gift, with children around the world.

We will once again be participating in OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD, in which we fill shoe boxes to be distributed to needy children around the world. This is a project of Samaritan's Purse, a Franklin Graham ministry in Boone, North Carolina.

HOW TO PACK YOUR BOX

We are asking anyone wishing to participate in this program to fill their shoe boxes at home and bring them to the church on or before Sunday, November 18th.

Your shoe boxes should be packed for children ranging in ages from 2-4 years old, 5-9 years old, or 10-14 years old.

Numerous shoe boxes have already been wrapped and are available outside the sanctuary, or you can wrap your own shoe box. Labels are available at church to place in the box, identifying if the items inside are for a boy or girl, and the appropriate age group.

Boxes are due by Sunday, November 18, 2018

Once we have filled our boxes, we will take them to a local distribution center where they will then be sent to another distribution center in North Carolina, and then will be sent out to the children.

POSTAGE is \$9.00

There is a \$9.00 postage charge for each box. Place the postage amount in the donation envelope and place the envelope on top of the gift items inside the box so it is clearly visible.

Checks should be made payable to Samaritan's Purse, with a note on the memo line that the gift is for Operation Christmas Child.

If you are unable to pay the postage, Salem will pick up this cost from our Mission Project No. 2.



The Life of David (Completed)

RECIPE

Slow-Cooker Apple Crisp

FOR THE TOPPING:

*

1 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
3/4 cup rolled oats
1/2 cup packed brown sugar
1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

FOR THE FILLING:

- Butter or cooking spray, for coating the slow cooker
- 6 medium apples (about 3 pounds), peeled, cored, and cut into 1inch chunks

1/4 teaspoon kosher salt 8 tablespoons unsalted butter, melted

1/3 cup granulated sugar 2 tablespoons all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon 1 tablespoon lemon juice

DIRECTIONS:

- 1. Place the flour, oats, sugar, cinnamon, and salt in a medium bowl and stir to combine. Pour in the melted butter and stir until the butter is completely incorporated into the dry ingredients and the mixture is wet and crumbly; set aside.
- 2. Generously coat the insert of a 6-quart or larger slow cooker with cooking spray or butter.
- Add the apples, sugar, flour, cinnamon, and lemon juice to the slow cooker, stir to combine, and spread into an even layer. Sprinkle the oat topping evenly over the apples.
- 4. Place a large sheet of paper towels over the slow cooker, making sure it completely covers the top of the slow cooker, but does not sag down onto the crisp. Cover with the slow-cooker lid. Set the slow cooker to HIGH and cook for 1 1/2 hours, or cook on LOW for 2 1/2 to 3 hours.
- Remove the lid and paper towels and cook, uncovered, until the topping is browned and crisp and the fruit is tender, about 1 more hour. Let the crisp cool at least 15 minutes uncovered before serving.

RECIPE NOTES:

Storage: Store the crisp in a covered container in the refrigerator for up to 5 days. Serve cold, room temperature, or rewarmed in a 300° F oven for 20 minutes. Serves 6.

Turmoil of one sort or another seems to frequently come into our lives. The cause for our turmoil may be serious or it may be just a minor annoyance of everyday life. Whatever the cause, turmoil can leave us feeling anxious.

Our Lord reminds us today that through him we can remain at peace even in our times of turmoil.

Matthew 11:28-29 – "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls."

In the entranceway to one of the older buildings at Johns Hopkins Hospital a large statue of Jesus stands, arms outstretched, with the words inscribed, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest."

Passersby write out prayers for hospitalized loved ones and lay them at Jesus' feet. For their loved ones and perhaps for themselves they are seeking God's rest in their time of weariness.
